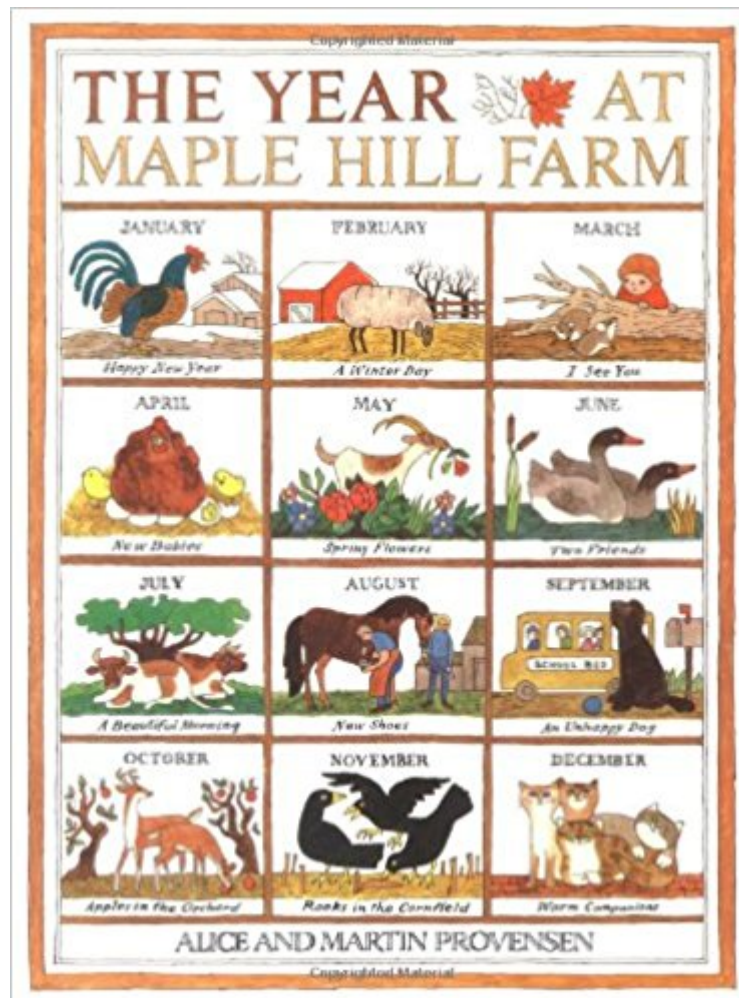

Alice Provensen is the author and illustrator of *Murphy in the City*, *A Day in the Life of Murphy*, and *Klondike Gold*. She collaborated with her late husband, Martin, on many other highly acclaimed picture books, including the Caldecott Medal-winning *The Glorious Flight* and Nancy Willard's Newbery Medal-winning *A Visit to William Blake's Inn*, which was also a Caldecott Honor Book. The Provenses have been on the New York Times list of the Ten Best Illustrated Books eight times. Alice lives in California.

This was a choice on my son's reading list for going into 1st grade. It was a nice, illustrative way to

show the progression and cyclical nature of seasons and how it affects animals, plants, and people. It goes through the months, which is also helpful to reinforce the calendar.

We love this book! It's got a little humor, and has a nice pace, following the goings-on of a farm month-to-month. My daughter returns to it again and again. It never gets old for us. The illustrations are sweet, too. I adore the illustrations by the Provenses in "The Color Kittens," by Margaret Wise Brown, so was thrilled to find this book by them.

For years, the favorite bedtime-reading story for both adults and kids in our family has been "Our Animal Friends at Maple Hill Farm", by Alice & Martin Provensen. When I saw this other book by the same authors, with a similar theme, I looked forward to a new favorite. I was disappointed. The format of this book is too small, so that the illustrations and text are not comfortable to look at. The colors are also too muted, for our taste. The story, such as it is, is lovely, and deserves a better-printed version than this. Would not recommend.

I was so happy to find another of these Provensen books! Animal Friends at Maple Hill Farm is my absolute favorite but this book is fantastic, too. It takes you through a year on the farm. Animal Friends is longer, fyi. I loved this one!!
