

We decided that we would let him read it anyway and it really helped him understand this part of history with a child-like history story. I would definitely recommend this book and the entire series for young readers who enjoy learning about history. He is 10 years old and doesn't have a hard time following the story. I did not read it so I cannot elaborate on the exact story. Great read for a young son.

I work in a K-5 elementary library and have bought all the "I Survived..." books for my elementary boys - though plenty of girls have also enjoyed them. They love the "true story line", the fast pace of the books, and the fact that they are small chapter books. This is a high interest series that caters wonderfully to those reluctant readers.

Good book. It really was an excellent way to introduce my son to the concept of the Nazis and what they did in Europe in World War II. I read this book first, just to make sure that there were not anything that I did not want my son reading, and it was very reader friendly, but truthful, at the same time.

This book handles the Holocaust with "kid gloves," which is impressive. I especially like the way she informs her young readers about this time in history without being overly descriptive because this causes a young, inquisitive mind to explore the subject for herself. I think this is even a good book to use with middle school students when introducing them to the topic of study.
