

I also didn't really enjoy any of the suggestions, and the authors didn't use a lot of citations. So in the end, it felt like an interview with two people who happened to work at childcare centers. For classroom materials, I expect more facts and research.

I still use this book as a reference when talking to people about the Whole Child Approach. I had to read it for a curriculum class, but it's worth the read even if you're not required to do so. Anyone working with kids, (teachers, foster parents, camp counselors,) should all browse through this text. It gives you a completely different perspective on teaching children.
