

As a piano teacher I really dislike the way this book is laid out. The progression just makes no

sense, and the beginner young kids I teach (all 6 years old) just can't grasp the concepts they throw at you on the first pages. The very first page has them playing C, D, and E, on the staff. I think it's bizarre. I much prefer the Alfred or Bastien books where you learn fingerings, rhythm, and black keys, white keys, THEN the staff. I really wish I hadn't wasted the money on this book. I'll probably use the songs later on in the book when my students learn to play on the staff, but it's just awful for beginners.

This book is much more advance then I imagined. Definitely don't get if you are wanting to teach a child between ages of 4-6 years old. Not really helpful when teaching them to keys. Not for super duper beginners. But the book itself is a nicely made book. The songs in the book aren't familiar songs. One traditional song in the book. Personally, I wouldn't recommend this book. I would get a different one.

I am on a beginner's level with my lessons and even tho I am familiar reading musical notes, I still feel this is a great book to start off if you are not. Overall I am pleased with this book.

My 12 year old daughter is just starting to self-teach herself how to play the piano. She has the background knowledge of how to read music. At first, she said this book was way too easy because the first part of this it just teaches you how to read music. However, my daughter enjoys playing the cute and easy to follow songs in this book.
