

Paintings In The Vatican



Synopsis

This illustrated volume brings together a collection of the paintings found in the Vatican City, one of the world's great artistic repositories. World-famous masterpieces by artists such as Leonardo da Vinci, Michelangelo, Raphael and Caravaggio are shown alongside works from the private rooms of the Papal apartments. Presented in chronological order from the 11th to the 18th centuries, the book gathers works from all three of the collections that constitute the Vatican Museum - the museum proper, the Vatican Library and portions of the Vatican Palace. Introductory essays by members of the Vatican's professional staff place the works in context and a fold-out of Michelangelo's recently restored Sistine Chapel ceiling is also included.

Written by directors of various Vatican Museum collections, this splendid catalog of the monumental collection housed within the walls of the Vatican offers insight into the political, social, and aesthetic history of Vatican City. The works described include those more familiar frescoes and altarpieces created specifically for the decoration of Papal apartments, Apostolic Palaces, the Sistine Chapel, Raphael Stanze, and the Borgia Apartments as well as works that have been unavailable for public viewing. The great accomplishment here is the listing of all works in chronological order, regardless of physical location, to create a comprehensive historical catalog of what is one of the world's greatest collections. This is an enormous book with hundreds of paintings excellently reproduced. There are many full page images. Those that are not are still quite large. There are many more images than text, which for me is how a book of art should be. Each chapter has several pages of introduction followed by many pages of images. The book notes that particular attention is given to the most splendid years of the High Renaissance. Chapters are:- History of the Collections- From the Year 1000 to the Thirteenth Century- The Twelfth and Thirteenth Centuries- The Fourteenth Centuries- The Fifteenth Centuries: Paintings- The Fifteenth Centuries: Frescoes- The Sixteenth Centuries: Paintings- The Sixteenth Centuries: Frescoes- The Seventeenth Centuries: Paintings- The Seventeenth Centuries: Frescoes- The Eighteenth Centuries: Paintings- The Eighteenth Centuries: Frescoes- Biographies of the Artists

This is a gorgeous compilation of art on public display at the Vatican. The Provenance and history of each selected piece is written in layman's language. The color plates are clear and precise. I especially appreciate the close-up detail views. Works that can only be admired from a distance are now accessible. For example, 49 pages are devoted to the Sistine Chapel. This is an excellent addition to the library of any lover of art and of the Church.
