

Their intricate sentences are animated by a tragic lyricism befitting the author, who was destined to be killed by his wife's young lover soon after he wrote these essays. Even specks of the unconscious racism here, if impolitic, can have redeeming charm (as when Euclides says of the Tacunas, dwellers on the upper Purus River, that they are "born looking old").
