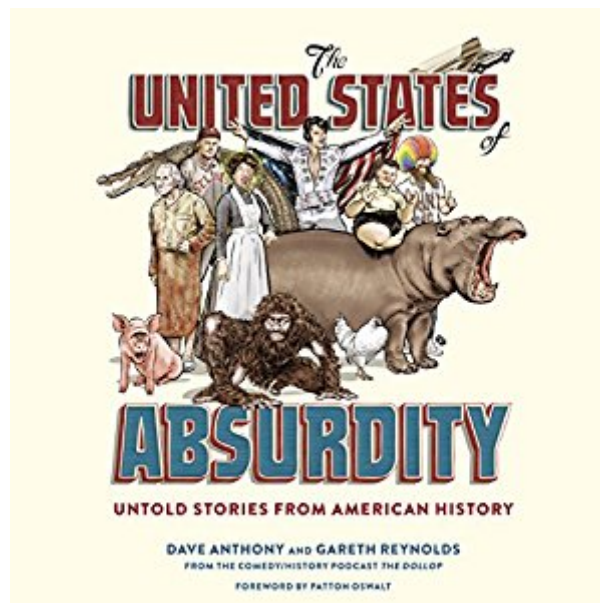




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The United States Of Absurdity: Untold Stories From American History

The true stories in this book are condensed and still amusing tales covered in The Dollop episodes. This book doesn't delve into those episodes (possibly because those stories cannot be summed up in 2-3 page tales), so there is plenty to explore there. And James Fosdike's illustrations are wonderful. He just gets The Dollop.
