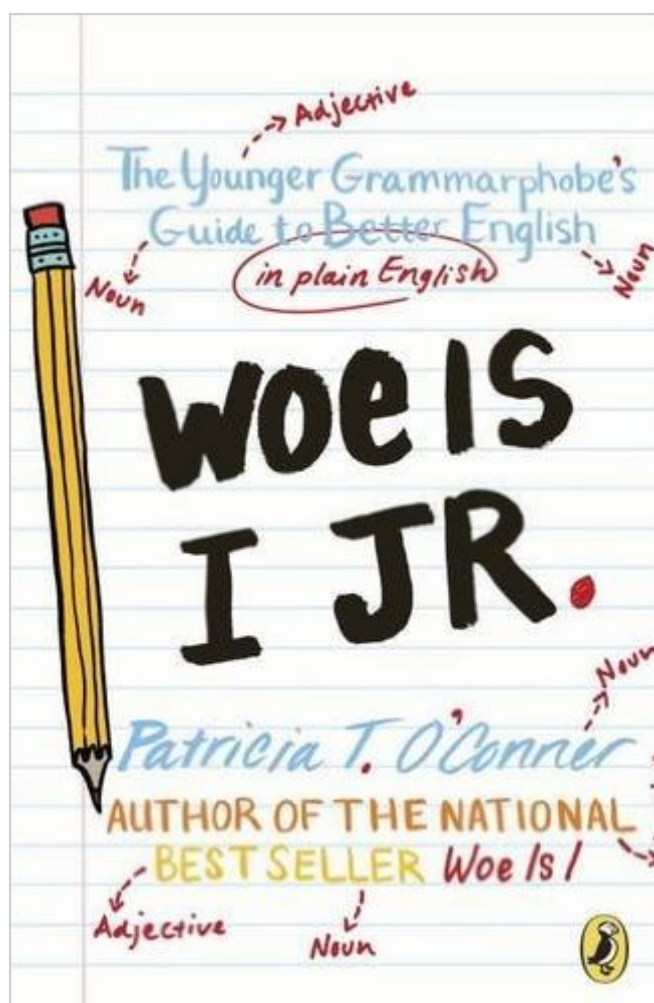

As a homeschool family I am always on the lookout for FUN educational resources. My kids are older but they still loved the concept of the book. It was a great refresher that was light-hearted but still full of information. It's the literary equivalent of sneaking veggies into a fruit smoothie. They liked all the 'references' of shows and books they've read/watched. It felt really geared toward their generation. For reference my children are tweenish (middle school). Should they struggle with grammar lessons I'm sure they will gladly pull this book for reference.

My ten-year-old grandson read and loved this! I teach English at a major university and recommend this to my students. Same rules as for adults, but charmingly rendered. This has helped many of my students with limited grammar and punctuation skills to display their knowledge and insights with clarity and eloquence.

This working text is very useful for young readers and writers - though it might cause some confusion if you were a 'natural' English speaker - you live in Britian or Ireland. I'd guess the age range to be 12 upwards, to get the best out of the book. Now if only parents would resist the temptation to gift their kids with 'swipe-screen' readers! Read well, and write better!

My son is in second grade, and his teacher suggested that I give him his own copy of this book because he enjoyed it so much at school. I was a bit skeptical about a grammar book being well received as a gift, but bought it and gave it to him for Christmas. When he unwrapped it, he started jumping up and down with excitement and quickly turned to the page that contained a poem about punctuation and recited it to us (over and over again!). The author really does make grammar fun.
