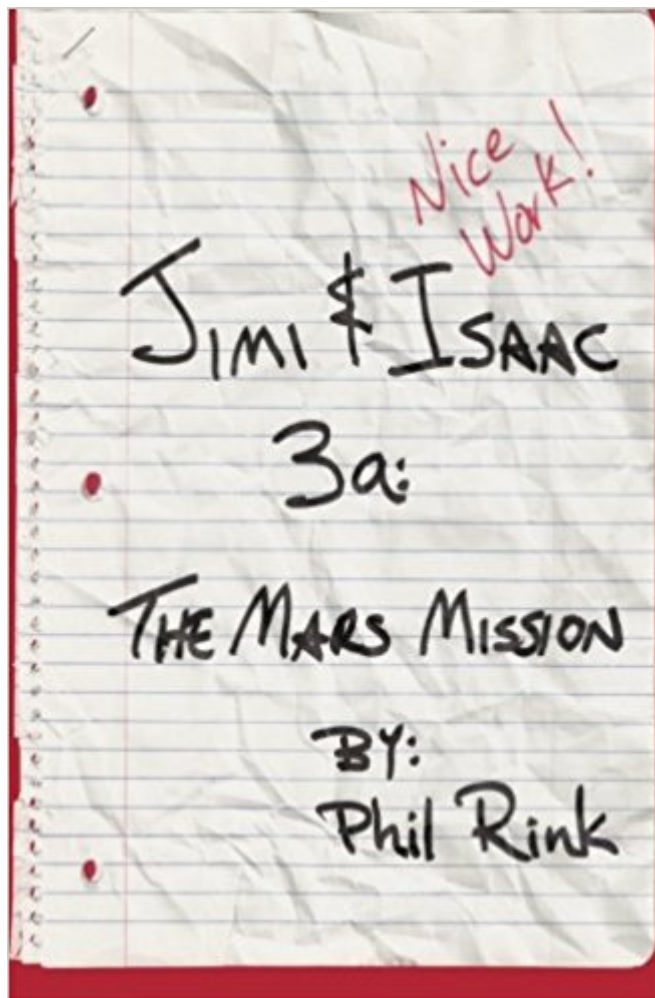

Sometimes they read like an instruction manual, because the kids that read Jimi and Isaac Books read a lot of instruction manuals and non-fiction. They watch TV shows and YouTube videos about building stuff, and they don't hesitate to tear something apart to see how it works. Our hope is that a focused kid will pickup one of our books for the stated subject matter, and then trust Jimi and Isaac enough to follow them into another area of interest. In every book, a problem presents itself and the boys need to learn and work to solve the problem. They fail constantly, struggle to recover, and success is often a less limited failure. The books are short and fast moving so more readers can succeed, but they are not simple books. Phil Rink is a Professional Mechanical Engineer, inventor (with eleven patents so far), entrepreneur, and science team and soccer coach. He's published a book on sailing the Caribbean, several magazine articles, and a few professional papers. He lives with his family in the upper left-hand corner of the United States of America.

What happens when a couple of seemingly ordinary middle school age boys decide to become rocket scientists in their spare time? This book is a fun-to-read tale about the incredible adventure of Jimi and Isaac, who are building a real Mars probe; and are working it in between soccer practice, Spanish tests and generally trying to stay out of trouble. The author has a wonderfully comedic ability to see the world through the eyes of an adolescent boy - whether dealing with annoying big sisters, conflicts with best friends, or embarrassing parents. And, inevitably, some valuable life lessons are learned along the way. Also impressive is the author's ability to explore and explain scientific concepts and product invention in ways that are fun and understandable, so that readers will learn something without even trying. An enjoyable read for both kids and their parents.

Jimi & Isaac 3a: The Mars Mission - I found myself laughing out loud at the antics of Jimi and Isaac, two boys that you sometimes have to wonder why they are even friends. Yet, as friends, they come to an understanding about what makes their friendship tick. Mr. Rink has put together a story for

With a fistful of cash and no idea where to start, the boys are going to Mars. Showing a great deal of teamwork, perseverance, humility, and forgiveness, Jimi builds a basic plan for a Mars probe. This is a great book for any young reader to dive into; Jimi has characteristics I wish many children had these days: respect for his parents, intelligence, inquisitiveness, determination, and dedication. There are a few places in the book where you chuckle a bit, but the majority of the story is based on the trials Jimi had to go through in order to reach a goal that many thought was unattainable by a young child. Never give up on dreams no matter how impossible they may seem.
